Rules

Dress Code

Our Student Ministry Dress Code is three-fold:

Clean, Neat & Modest

1. Middle of summer – plan appropriately.
2. Refrain from wearing in public any shorts/skirts/pants/etc. with writing/words on the backside.
3. No hats/pajamas worn during worship.
4. Refrain from wearing clothing displaying messages of vulgarity, obscenity and/or the promotion/use of alcohol/drugs/tobacco.
5. Do not come out of your room unless you are *FULLY DRESSED* (no short-shorts or tank-tops).
6. Spaghetti strap/tank tops must be worn with something over them or straps must be credit-card width.
7. No strapless/halter tops
8. Shorts must be long enough for fingers to touch cloth when arms are fully extended.
9. One-piece or tankini bathing suits for the pool.
